Club Rules

- Be kind and respectful to everyone
- Treat everyone's property carefully
- Be respectful of all equipment and facilities
- Be honest
- Listen to all adults and leaders and follow their instructions
- Violent behaviour will not be tolerated

If these rules are broken, the club will apply the following procedure:

We will talk to the child(ren) involved to establish the facts of any incident and ensure they understand their responsibilities and what behaviour is expected of them.

Yellow and red cards are given for undesirable behaviour. Incidents will be recorded in our incident book.

The below points are to be used as a guide and are not an exhaustive list of behaviours. For children with SEND reasonable adjustments may be needed to ensure the consequence is developmentally appropriate.

Yellow Card

- Swearing
- Arguing
- Hurting someone with words
- Hurting someone, e.g. pushing
- Disrespecting equipment
- Repeatedly disrupting activities
- Repeatedly not following instructions given by an adult or junior leader
- Being rude or talking back to an adult or junior leader



Possible Consequences:

- Not being able to take part in an activity
- Reparation of damage, e.g. helping to tidy if a mess has been made
- Staying with an adult for some reflection time
- Conversation with club coordinator

Red Card

- 2 yellow cards within a half term amount to a red card
- Intentional physical harm (leaving a mark)
- Violent behaviour
- Extreme rudeness
- Bullying (for the purposes of this policy defined as deliberately hurtful behaviour by an individual or a group, repeated over a period of time, and directed against an individual or a group)

→ Consequences:

- A red card leads to the child missing club for at least a week with the parents/carers being informed of the incident.
- If a child is issued with 3 red cards during a term, then the child will miss the remainder of the term with immediate effect.

If undesirable behaviours of a child continue or in the event of unprovoked violent behaviour, a permanent red card may be issued and the child will be excluded from attending the club.

This policy is designed to support the children and staff of the club and aims to help make the club a friendly, fun place for all.
